Angels Baseball is a proud partner and supporter of the Boys & Girls Clubs in Orange County. Eight years ago, the Angels, the Boys & Girls Clubs in Orange County and Major League Baseball partnered together to create the Angels' Gene Autry Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities (RBI) League.

This youth program, offered to Orange County Boys & Girls Club members, provides an opportunity for 12 to 18-year-olds to play baseball and softball and learn important life skills. All RBI League players receive a full game uniform and a league cap. Participants are also provided with catcher's gear, bats, balls and helmets.

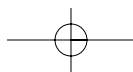
Angels Baseball Foundation Golf Tournament
